



World Social Science Report 2013

Historical evolution

- Begun as a council of high-level advisors to UNESCO in 1953
- Through next couple of decades largely a mechanism for UNESCO to support the international social science disciplinary associations
- With drying out of resources directed at social sciences, ISSC had to reinvent itself
- Enlarged membership, developing new activities (WSSForum, Report, Fellows, sponsor research prog and networks), and now a research funder (T2S)







World Social Science Forum

The 2015 Forum is hosted and organised by a consortium of African partners led by HSRC and CODESRIA.





WSS Fellows Overview

- Objective to manage the ISSC's role in global social science capacity development
 - early career scientists, post-doc
 - institutions from lower and middle income countries (LMIC)
 - international research collaboration
- ➤ Thematic focus on interdisciplinary social science knowledge production in global priority areas with particular reference to LMIC
- > Fellows' seminars core component of the programme's work
 - Intensive working meetings
 - 20 competitively selected Fellows work with senior scientists and others

Risk Interpretation and Action

- → 4x \$15,000 seed grants for collaborative research projects Dec 2014

 - Integrating indigenous knowledge into decision-making and policy-making for DRR
 - 3. Multi-scale policy implementation for natural hazard risk reduction: Preliminary results
 - 4. Communication influences on decision-making in disaster recovery and reconstruction: Implications for RIA framework
- Support for 10 Fellows to attend Beijing IRDR conference: present, writing workshops

WZB-ISSC Global Fellowship Programme

- Early career social scientists from LMIC working on global priority problems with particular relevance to developing countries.
- 1 Fellow per year stipend to conduct research for 6 months at WZB Berlin Social Science Research Centre
- 2 Global Fellows selected 2014-15.

Rio+20 (special grant opportunity): participated actively in the Forum on Science, Technology and Innovation for Sustainable Development and observed the negotiations at the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development

Rio+20: 7 articles written thus far.

Some results since 2012 launch ...


- 550 applications were received selection of 73 Fellows (anticipated 300 Fellows)
 - 48% from (LMIC)
 - 60% women
 - 14 senior social scientists
- Publications, university courses/teaching materials, collaborative research proposals and writing projects, career boost
- « Untamed Urbanism » book (open access, Routledge)

Transformations to Sustainability

A social science research fund

Main objectives

- Increase the social science (incl. behavioural and economic sciences) contributions on the processes of social transformations needed to secure solutions to the problems of global change and sustainability
- Increase the use of such knowledge by policy makers, practitioners, the private sector, citizens and activists -
- Principle: Social transformation as an overarching, integrative framework - connecting poverty, development and global environmental change research communities
 - Major contribution to the work of Future Earth.





Transformations to Sustainability

- Trans-national collaboration involving partners from 3 or more countries, incl. from at least one LMIC
- Integrated research led by social scientists in concrete contexts of application
- Engage societal stakeholders as knowledge partners in the coproduction and co-dissemination of solutions-oriented knowledge for sustainability
- Capacity building: one principal investigator or project leader from a LMIC and involvement of early career researchers
- > April 2014: call for pre-proposals (500/30x € 30.000,00 for 6.5 mths)
- > 1st TKN conference, Nov 2014, Postdam
- March 2015 TKN selections (3x € 300.000,00 per year for 3 yrs)


Complex global realities


- Inseperability of environmental, social, political and economic problems
- Embeddedness in diverse physical and social practices
- Multiple consequences and increasingly complex risk profiles



- to provide better understandings of the complexity of the challenges we face,
- to accelerate the production of relevant knowledge,
- to be more effective at meeting user requirements,
- to inform livable, just solutions, and
- to shape deliberate and deliberative policy making and implementation

A global TD training initiative: 16-18 June 2014, Paris ISSC with NRF, START, ICSU



- A generic 5 day training workshop

- Identify a pool of experts from different regions as potential trainers/contributors

- Agree on convening and selection processes, branding
- Max 25 participants (competitively selected?)
- Covering all fields of science
- Covering conceptual and practice dimensions of TD
- Including research management and evaluation module
