



Report of the London ICoE-RIA International Centre of Excellence for Risk Interpretation and Action



Overview

- The London ICoE-RIA was formed in November 2015
- Currently includes King's College London, University College London and the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine
- Aims to provide a focal point for the expertise available in London institutions concerning DRR and CCA
- Focus is Risk Interpretation and Action:
 - Decision-making for uncertainty
 - Early-warning systems
 - Adaptive management and resilience
 - Individual perceptions and risk behaviour

UK Alliance for Disaster Research

- All partners in the London ICoE are involved in the Founding Board of the new UK Alliance for Disaster Research
- Aims to be a "network of networks", allowing government to speak to science and vice versa in the UK – to help UK government bring science into its Sendai implementation
- Terms of reference currently being agreed
- So far involvement from 6 academic institutions, several government agencies, the Royal Society and the British Geological Survey
- ICoE will host a conference at King's College in January 2017

Meeting participation and workshops

- 26-28 January 2016 Five members attended the ISDR Science for Sendai conference: presented six posters, attended a press briefing with the new ISDR director and acted as co-reporter for one conference session
- KCIRRR meetings monthly, including external speakers (e.g. ODI) and collaborators
- The emBRACE Project Conference: Framing Community Disaster Resilience: resources, capacities, learning and action. Kings College London, Strand Campus.
- May 18th 2015: Learning Workshop hosted by King's CIRRR
- October 1st 2015: King's CIRRR Workshop Learning: from theory to practice. Aimed at NGO's who are in the START/DEPP LPPR partnerships as well as BRACED.


