Surge in multi-scalar influence and reach

- Disaster risk-related academic progs expand.
- Five new cross-disciplinary progs awaiting approval.
- Sustained growth in student numbers.
- High profile engagement with African Union and international agencies at consultative meeting in Bahir Dar.
- Advanced negotiation with WFP-NEPAD on 'NEPAD-ARCH'

31 new disaster risk-oriented academic progs and modules reached 1,069 students.

Up from 21 progs and modules in 2016 (10 new courses across partnership) to service growing demand in Africa for univ-qualified DRM practitioners and academics/researchers.
