

# IRDR Publication

An **IRDR Publication** is a published scientific output resulting from research activities related to the Integrated Research on Disaster Risk (IRDR) programme that contributes directly to the programme's mission and objectives. All IRDR publications can be downloaded from:

To be recognised and classified as an IRDR Publication, a work should meet at least one of the following criteria:

## Core Criteria

1. **Officially Issued:** A peer-reviewed publication with explicit reference to an/the IRDR programme (see items 2 and 3 below) or a document commissioned directly by IRDR.
2. **Directly Funded Output:** A result of research funded or co-sponsored, or solicited by IRDR.
3. **Author Affiliation:** Authored or co-authored by a member of the IRDR community (namely, the Scientific Committee, National Committees, International Centres of Excellence, Young Scientists Programme, Fellows, Executive Director, and Science Officers) or invited experts. The author(s) should request the relevant IRDR body for permission to publish their work under the IRDR affiliation.

## Supporting Criteria

4. **Substantive Collaboration:** Research developed through collaboration with IRDR, even without direct funding. A publication should **not** be claimed as an IRDR Publication if the connection is only incidental (e.g., a brief mention in the text without direct support or affiliation).
5. **Formal Acknowledgement:** A specific acknowledgement of IRDR for providing essential data, framework, the support central to the research or related issues. All IRDR publications should include a line in a formal acknowledgement, such as:

*"The Integrated Research on Disaster Risk (IRDR) programme is acknowledged for providing ..."* Or

*"This work was financially supported by the Integrated Research on Disaster Risk (IRDR) programme."* Or

*"This research was done in the framework of the Integrated Research on Disaster Risk (IRDR) programme."*

A member of the IRDR community who wishes to have a publication designated as an “IRDR Publication” should contact the IRDR International Programme Office (IPO) ([connect@irdrinternational.org](mailto:connect@irdrinternational.org)), explaining reasons for the request (e.g., IRDR contributions/involvements, impacts aligned to IRDR’s mission and action plan). Authors are responsible for accurately representing their IRDR affiliation.

Based on the criteria (items 1-5), IPO should decide whether the publication may be included in the **IRDR Publications**.

The use of the official IRDR logo on any publication requires prior notification and approval from the IRDR IPO.
